The advantage of this town is that I could work and think in a quite place, in a very comfortable flat, supported by very good amount of money, in pretty medieval ambient, baroque buildings and cobble-stoned streets, near Danube and surrounded by a lot of "Heiriger" and bars.

Krems centre is lovely but for my prose and me Stein was a special experience. Every day I used to walk there and "invent stories" about Stein's windows, doors, passages, small squares; if we take into account that Zechner, the composer and Kremser Schmidt, the painter lived there and marked the place for ever, we can say that my walks always had sound and image. I managed to write almost 30 pages of my novelle and to put together all those scattered parts of the novel that I've been writing for 5 years. I also took this opportunity to focus more on my German in order to be able to read material related to Zechner, Schmidt, history of Vienna, Kaffehauser, and everything else I need for my writing.

I didn't miss anything and I appreciated people's kindness and cordiality.
